


# #ALONETOGETHER September 2020

## **Monday 7th September**

You're now required to wear a face covering in lots of places. If you could design your own face mask, what would you like it to look like? What message would you like to send out to all of the people you encounter? Draw a picture, write a message or colour in this mask template.



### **Monday 14th September**

Did you know you can make a yummy chocolate cake using some simple store cupboard ingredients, a mug and a microwave?

Find the biggest mug you have. Add:

- 2 tablespoons of self raising flour
- 2 tablespoons of caster sugar
- 1 tablespoon of cocoa powder and MIX!
- Add HALF a medium egg and mix again
- Add 2 tablespoons of milk
- Add 1 tablespoon of vegetable or sunflower oil and mix until smooth
- Add some chocolate chips, nuts or raisins if you have them!
- Cook it on high in the microwave for 2 minutes
- Enjoy your chocolate mug cake!

## **Monday 21st September**

Monday 21st September is United Nations International Peace Day. Can you write down three ways you could make your life more peaceful?
